
WHY GO TO UNIVERSITY?

- Type of area








HOW TO CHOOSE?

- UCAS is a central clearing house
- The only method of entry to UK degree programmes
- 5 choices
- All Applications done electronically
- Includes a reference and personal statement



APPLICATIONS

- Consistent and realistic choices
- Invisible applications
- Make sure that you meet all the entry requirements
- Plagiarism
- Interviews
- Admissions Tests

TIMELINE



- September 2014
 Applications for 2015 entry begin
- Deadline for Oxford, Cambridge, Dentistry, Medicine and Vet Science
- 15 January 2015
 Closing date for applications
- End March 2015
 Majority of decisions made
- Early May 2015
 Deadline for applicants to make replies to offers
